Each year, the President of the United States issues a proclamation announcing July 27th as a day of national observance in honor of Korean War veterans and their families. There are observances of this day on military bases, at military cemeteries such as Arlington National Cemetery, and more informal observances held in America, South Korea, and elsewhere.

Photo above: The Korean War Veterans Memorial in Washington, DC was dedicated in 1995 to 1.5 million American men and women who served in the Korean War from 1950-1953. The expansive memorial includes a group of 19 statues that depict soldiers on patrol facing an American flag. A granite wall has a mural of the faces of 2,400 unnamed soldiers with a reading that states "Freedom is not free." A Pool of Remembrance honors all soldiers who were killed, wounded or missing in action. The Memorial Foundation is currently promoting legislation to add a Wall of Remembrance to the Memorial, listing the names of the veterans.

# ELKS AND VETERANS PARTICIPATE IN THE 2022 NORMANDY, FRANCE D-DAY MEMORIAL PARADE

On June 6, 1944, Allied forces crossed the English Channel and landed on the beaches of Normandy, France to liberate Western Europe from the occupation of Nazi Germany. With 176,000 troops arriving by landing craft and ships, as well as nearly 14,000 aircraft, the Allied forces were able to secure Northern France within 3 months despite a vicious effort by Nazi forces.

Each year on June 6, Sainte Mere Eglise, the first village to be liberated by American paratroopers, hosts this historic parade. Military units, marching bands, cultural and civic groups march down the same streets that were lined with American troops in 1944. The town has since named their streets after Allied Generals including General Eisenhower. They have also preserved WWII era artifacts in the WWII museum in the center of town. The Mayor has expressed his best wishes and looked forward to greeting the parade participants as they visited his wonderful village. In addition to the parade a concert series was staged in the town square that featured outstanding performing groups.

This event has been recognized by numerous veterans associations, community organizations, military and government officials and provides participants and spectators an opportunity to salute those men and women who have sacrificed for our nation.





### A Soft Place for Veterans in Need to Land

Founded in March 2013, Heaven on Earth for Veterans, Inc. (HOEV) provides quality living spaces for veterans in need. HOEV is a 501(c)(3), non-profit. The organization's founders include 3 women: a retired Army officer, a real estate entrepreneur and a communications specialist with a background in non-profits.

HOEV purchases and fully furnishes houses in Pinellas County to offer living spaces for veterans who cannot afford to own or rent on their own. We include all household equipment from silverware to linens to pots and pans to laundry facilities. Veterans lease private bedrooms and share the common living areas. The cost of renting a bedroom ranges from \$400 to \$600 per month. All utilities are included as well as cable and internet access in the common area. In addition, common areas within the homes are cleaned by a cleaning service biweekly.

An additional long term goal of HOEV is to provide free, temporary housing to veterans to bridge the time gap between requesting financial support and actually receiving that support. In short, once an individual is verified as a veteran, they and their family will not be homeless - they will be given a free, safe, transitional place to stay.




